


The work tries to navigate the intricate maze of human thoughts, reflecting on how easy it is to get lost within the complex architecture of the mind.

By integrating illusion-based techniques, I examined the interplay between structure and perception. This piece also challenged me to expand my skills in scaled perception drawing through deliberate experimentation.

Guiding Light

This lampshade artwork captures eight Kuchipudi dance movements, reflecting my 12-year journey with the art form. Inspired by my Rangapravesham-solo debut- this piece explores how a dancer shapes and is shaped by space. I realized emotion emerges not only from movement but also clothing, jewellery, and spatial presence. The lamp's reflections revealed how a body transforms its surroundings, echoing architecture's ability to hold and evoke feeling.

This piece reflects how Amritsar and Delhi have shaped me. Using their maps, I depict my portrait as an amalgamation of both cities—their cultures, architectures, and my experiences within them. The red thread traces my physical and emotional journey, suggesting how these places influenced me and how I, in turn, left my mark.

Medium: Modeling Clay, Acrylic Paints, Gold Leaf







This piece explores the duality of fragility and strength. Jaipur blue-pottery floral motifs signify delicacy, while the horse represents nature's resilience despite its vulnerability. The contrast between organic motifs and geometric patterns further highlights this tension, revealing how stability and fragility coexist within natural forms and architectural expression.

Suspended Harmony

Inspired by Sergio Musmeci's bridge, this model explores architecture that enhances rather than disrupts its natural setting. I investigated minimal impact on topography, fluid structural forms, and sustainable alternatives. The flowing roof and light-oriented openings reflect my aim to integrate built space with the environment while refining my own design approach.

Revenge- Final piece

"Revenge" examines how architecture often consumes nature, despite nature's ultimate power to reclaim space. By using natural materials, I highlight the need for balance—an approach where built forms coexist with the environment rather than override it. This piece reflects my belief that architecture reaches its potential through harmony, not dominance.

by Hand, in Bloom




Observation Sketches Mehrauli Archaeological Park



Gothic Elegance- Exploration






Paradise

Medium: Digital Composition on Procreate


